Masks for the Vulnerable



Boosting Aerospace Career Pathways

ITE and the Republic of Singapore Air Force (RSAF) have launched a new Work-Study Diploma (WSDip) in Aircraft Maintenance Engineering, which allows ITE graduates to earn a Diploma while serving their National Service as Air Force Technicians. This is the first WSDip programme for full-time National Servicemen (NSFs).

It is open to NSFs with relevant ITE qualifications, in areas such as Aerospace Technology and Mechanical Engineering.

Under a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed on 22 September 2020, ITE and RSAF will be collaborating with ST Engineering Aerospace Limited, SIA Engineering Company Limited, and the Association of Aerospace Industries (Singapore) to develop the curriculum and accord industry recognition to the programme.

On 13 October 2020, ITE signed two MOUs with the National Trades Union Congress (NTUC) to promote staff and student development.

Under the first MOU, ITE will be collaborating with the Union of the ITE Training Staff (UITS) and the Amalgamated Union of Public Employee (AUPE) to set up an ITE-Union Company Training Committee (CTC). The CTC will provide a framework for staff training, and allow NTUC's union members to leverage ITE's courses for training opportunities.

The second MOU involves a partnership between ITE, NTUC Club and the Employment and Employability Institute (e2i) to enhance the work-readiness of ITE students, through internships and job placement opportunities.

Mr Ng Chee Meng, Secretary-General of NTUC, witnessed the virtual signing of the MOUs.
